

Rabbit Resistant Plants for the Las Vegas Valley

This list is not foolproof! If your resident rabbits are hungry enough, they'll eat just about anything. If possible, protect all new plants with chicken wire initially, and avoid over-fertilizing. Additionally, use the largest plants you can afford (for example, use 5 gallon plants instead of 1 gallon). Happy Gardening!
